**Our Imperfections**

As parishioners who attended the February 1, 10:30 service are aware, our electrical contractor had completed installation of energy-efficient LED bulbs in all 74 of the lighting fixtures located high on the ceiling of the nave and sanctuary the week before. Accessing the bulbs was no mean feat, requiring use of a lift that had to be brought in from Boston, removal of pews and the nerve to work from a bouncy basket almost 40 feet above the floor. Thanks to the fortuitous discovery of the original lighting design plan, our contractor was able to obtain LED equivalents to the original bulbs so that we could see our main worship space illuminated as it was originally intended – a first for all but the most senior among us. Seeing the glow of all 74 bulbs on Sunday morning was a moment of great joy for those of us who have long watched the sanctuary become dimmer and dimmer as 15-year-old incandescent bulbs burned out. However, as we did one final inspection with the contractor on Monday, we discovered two bulbs that were not lit. Anticipating that some sockets may have to be replaced while he was replacing bulbs, our contractor had ordered ten replacement sockets before beginning the job. Unfortunately, he had already used nine of those replacement sockets, leaving us with only one, which the contractor used to repair one fixture, leaving one lamp still out. After a long discussion, we decided that the costs of extending the lift rental until a replacement socket could be shipped from Texas were not warranted for one bulb. We will live with the imperfection. Like our lights, St. Paul's is not perfect, but we live with the imperfections, maintaining focus on our larger mission: worshiping God, encourage others to grow in the Spirit, nurturing a compassionate community, and serving those in need. The unlit bulb will be difficult to find, but like all imperfections, you can find it if you look hard enough. Instead, let all of us focus less on our imperfections and more on how we continue to build St. Paul's as a light in our community.

### **Deacon's Discretionary Fund**

St. Paul's has traditionally deposited the loose plate receipts on the first Sunday of each month to the rector's discretionary fund. As the name implies, the rector may use these funds at their discretion, but they are most commonly used to address unfunded emergency needs of the parish or for charitable purposes. The vestry had suspended this practice when the rector's position was vacated earlier this year, but now that we have been blessed with a deacon, the vestry has resumed the practice as the deacon's discretionary fund. You may contribute anonymously to the deacon's discretionary fund through a loose plate offering on a first Sunday, or you may make a directed donation by check or cash placed in an envelope.
